

5. Student Support and Progression

- 5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services
 - Adequate facilities for filtered drinking water have been provided in all the hostels.
 - All the floors in the academic buildings have been provided with filtered water cooler to serve the students.
 - Equipments have been bought and the Gymnasium has been refurbished.
 - In order to facilitate computer related skills of the scholars, a separate and compulsory course on some basic computer programmes has been introduced for the scholars of the M.Phil and Ph.D courses.
 - School of Languages is running successfully short term courses on twenty languages both national and foreign with nominal fees.
 - Braille Corner is available in the Library for the benefit of the Visually Impaired Student. Screen Reading Software-JAWS is used for this purpose.

- Employment oriented guidance programme is conducting courses for competitive examination like NET, SET, WBCS, SSC etc. with nominal fees. Moreover these trainings are also imparted to the students belonging to the OBC (non creamy layer), SC and ST free of cost under the guidance of some faculty members. This programme has been continuing successfully.
- On campus Medical Centre with a full time doctor, two pharmacist and two nurses is operating.
- An Ambulance has been procured to serve the students in medical emergency.
- A battery operated car is available in the campus to help the Physically Challenged persons to move around.
- There is an on campus students' Cheap Stores including photocopy facility which has been of enormous help to the students.
- The entire admission process of the students has been made online.
- Medals and awards are distributed to deserving students each year during the Convocation Programme encouraging them to do even better.
- An on campus job assistance for students run by the government of West Bengal is operating.
- Internal Complaint Cell and Anti Ragging Cell are working as per the new UGC guideline.

Different committees and cells have been constituted by the Executive Council (EC) of the University from time to time to monitor and evaluate the progress of the work. These committees remain accountable to the EC and thereby the EC overall monitors the activities of the University.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

After the introduction of CBCS, Curriculum of different subjects have been reformulated and reorganized to increase the mobility of the students across the disciplines. The purpose of this exercise is to provide the students with a holistic training in education. In M.Phil. and Ph.D. levels the curriculum has been prepared following the UGC structure where Research Ethics has been duly emphasized.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The university takes pride in the cordial relation that exists among the teachers and the students. Apart from the traditional chalk-board system, teachers use the gadgets provided in the Smart Class Rooms making audio-visual presentations to get the students more involved in the class rooms. Continuous Internal assessments are encouraged to help students prepare for the end semester examination. Several experts from outside the university are regularly invited to give lectures on topics related to the curriculum to encourage the students to think critically on the topics covered in the curriculum.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

With the introduction of semester system at all levels, the volume of the work related to examination has increased manifold. The university holds examination following the Academic Routine and publishes the results within due date. All the teachers and research scholars take part in invigilation duties. The evaluation is done by both the internal and external experts. In cases of evaluation of M.Phil. and Ph.D dissertations experts from outside the state are invited.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The university feels that research is the most important element in the academic life of a university. IQAC has organized workshop, involving the teachers, on the modalities of applying for research projects, different funding agencies, both Governmental and Non-Governmental. The university constantly updates its teachers of the different openings regarding research projects advertised.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The library catalogue has been digitized. The library catalogue is accessible to teachers from outside the campus.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Representation of teaching & non teaching staff on the Court and the Executive Council & various others statutory bodies of the University is ensured as per the State Government order time to time.. Involvement of such personnel in various Committees & sub committees helps effective operation of the university system.

The University accommodates at various levels the representation of various stakeholders like students, teachers, non teaching staff, eminent citizens, community representatives on various bodies as per the UGC guidelines.

The University develops its student as a prime human resource through variety of activities like, N.S.S., N.C.C., social and Cultural activities, Games and sports etc.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Periodically the university recruits teachers and non-teaching staff to fill up the vacant posts. All these recruitments are done following the Reservation rules of the Govt. and other relevant Govt. orders that come from time to time.

Many IT industries come to campus for campus Interview. Students from Visual faculty have been selected through campus Interview in areas like Animation, Design etc.
