

Theme

Kavi Bijoy Sarkar is one of the most popular lyricists, composers, and musicians in Bengal. The name he got by birth is Bijoy Sarkar Adhikari. Later he was known as Bijoy Sarkar all over the country for his huge popularity in Kavi gaan. He was born on 28 February 1903 in a remote village Dumdi in the Greater Jessore district. Due to the sudden death of his father the development of formal education had stopped in the 10th standard by 1926. He started learning Kavi gaan from Manohar Sarkar of Durgapur village in Gopalganj. After two years he also became the disciple of Rajendra Sarkar for one year in the year 1926, he formed his own group and started to perform publicly.

Initially, Bijoy Sarkar used to sing Rabindra Sangeet and Nazrul Geeti, along with Kavi gaan. At the time of his performance, people became inundated with joy by hearing his innumerable compositions. The Government of Bangladesh awarded the posthumous 'Ekushey Padak' to Bijoy Sarkar in 2013. He spent his last few years in India for better optical treatment but could not get back his site again he died on 4th December 1985 in India at the age of 83.
